

# Woman Killed In Auto Wreck At Ranger

A 71-year-old Greenfield, Ohio woman was killed in a two-car crash at Ranger Friday afternoon and her 63-year-old husband was badly injured.

Mrs. Flora Deboss Limes was killed instantly when a car driven by Clyde Woodrow Morris, of Ellijay, entered US 411 from Doyal's Truck Stop and crashed into the Ohio vehicle. Her Husband, Harry H. Limes suffered concussion multiple lacerations and abrasions on the head and body.

The two young sons of Morris were injured in the accident. Bobby Morris, 12, suffered concussions loss of all teeth, a broken jaw, fracture of the right hip, and severe lacerations about the head and face. Kenneth Morris, 9, suffered concussion, a basal skull fracture and severe lacerations of the scalp, legs and back.

The State Patrol said a case was lodged against Morris charging him with "failure to grant right of way."

Hospital officials in Carterville reported Tuesday that Mr. Limes was "doing nicely" and would be released that day to return to his home in Greenfield, Ohio.
