Mrs. Littlefield Dies Wednesday

Beloved Calhoun Matron -Passes at Emory Hospital

Calhoun friends were shocked and saddened Wednesday to learn of the death of Mrs. John B. Littlefield, one of the city's most beloved women, which occurred at Emory University hospital in Atlanta at 6 o'clock Wednesday morning. Mrs. Littlefield had been in a critical condition for several weeks, and her death was not unexpected.

Funeral services will be held at the First Methodist church of which she was a member at 11 o'clock this (Thursday) morning. Rev. W. H. Gardner and Rev. J. T. Eakes will conduct the services.
