William Virgie Lyons, 70, died in an Atlanta hospital Sept. 7 at 6:15 a. m. He had been in declining health for several months. He was reared near Calhoun, the son of Mr. and Mrs. A. R. Lyons. He was a veteran of World War I having served in France in the battle of Arognne Forest. Following his discharge he made his home in Atlanta. He joined the Blackwood Baptist Church at the age of 16 years.

He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Allen Cates of Huston, Texas; one son, Billy Lyons of Milledgeville; five grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Dock Brown of Calhoun and several nieces and nephews.
