O'Neal Collection consists of about 31,500 4x5 inch acetate negatives which are housed in 10,814 envelopes. The collection spans the years 1923 to 1975 with the bulk of the negatives dating from 1950 to 1974. Some of the images are copy negatives of photographs which date as early as 1889. The envelopes are arranged chronologically by year, then alphabetically within each year.  The collection documents the history and social life of Atlanta, Georgia through images of organizations, events, facilities, and portraits. Notable are images of companies, the Atlanta labor community, local buildings, weddings, sports, and the Shriners Yaarab Temple. 31	Berry College Archives	Berry College Memorial Library	Floyd	Michael O'Malley 706-238-5886 momalley@berry.edu	Martha Berry Papers	Miss Martha McChesney Berry, founder of the Berry Schools, dedicated her life to providing an education to the youth of Southern Appalachia. The schools began with The Boys' Industrial School in 1902; the focus was to prepare the boys to deal with "...the common problems of everyday life on the farm, in the store, or at the workbench." In 1909, Miss Berry opened the Martha Berry School for Girls. Along with a commitment to academics, it aimed to train the mountain girls for homemaking. The Schools sought to educate not only the head, but the heart and hands as well. Students had the opportunity to hold campus jobs and earn their tuition by exchanging hours of work as tuition payment. The Martha Berry papers contain office correspondence, subject files, a copy of Miss Berry's last will and testament, newspaper clippings about Miss Berry and the Berry Schools and several manuscripts and speeches. The oldest materials are letters dating back to the beginning of the schools in 1902. The bulk of the collection dates from 1922-1941. The largest volume of material is Miss Berry's office correspondence. Most of this collection was transferred from a dormitory attic on the Berry College Campus and from the Martha Berry Museum.
