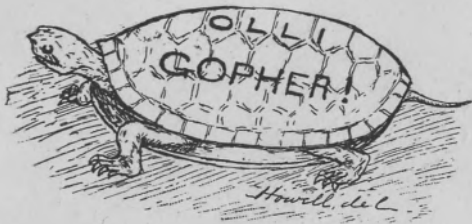

The Law Class.

THE law class of '88, is beyond comparison the best that has ever attended the University of Georgia. Without going into a discussion of the mental abilities, and without mentioning the many college honors won by that class, a comparison of the numerical strength of the law class of '88 with that of preceding classes in the law class department will afford evidence of the increasing prominence of the legal department of the State University. Under the skilful direction of Professor Thomas the law department has so materially increased its usefulness as now to compare favorably with the older departments of the college. Professors Thomas, Cobb and Benedict are without superiors in the South, in their specialties, and the course prescribed by them is practical and comprehensive, and it is now no longer necessary for the young men of Georgia to leave their State to obtain a thorough knowledge of the principles of law.

The accommodations accorded this department are meagre and inadequate. With a special building, complete library, and State aid, the law college of the University of Georgia would excel any in the South. Will the Legislature make it so?
